III. New Business

A. President Johnston

1. State of the College-

- a) Three most important aspects of SGA- being eyes and ears for the student, collecting ideas, Being visible on campus, Extending the reputation of the campus.
- b) The mission of the College-To provide student-centered, comprehensive career development programs and services that empower both students and alumni to achieve their lifelong career goals.
- c) Importance of student success- We are focused and work towards the success of students and working towards graduation. 2019 grads will earn 1.2 million dollars more than graduates that did not attend CCGA. Over 75% of our students that graduate stay in the Coastal Georgia region.
- d) Enrollment- This summer we had the highest summer enrollment in the history of the college, and it has been growing consecutively. 3,457 students and 102 more students register for second session courses. Students ranging from 35 states and 20 countries We only had a small decline in enrollment after COVID-19
- e) Top five majors are business, health sciences, biology, psychology, and criminal justice. Recent Degrees are the first bachelors of hospitality and tourism in the state of Georgia. We've also added a bachelor of Environmental Science recent . Newest degree is the bachelors of Data Science.
- f) Economic Impact- The college has made a huge positive increase in the economy. The college makes a difference and adds a lot of jobs in the community. By bringing students or employees in we are also bringing people to the businesses here.
- g) The Residence Halls are getting close to maxing out.
- h) After sharing and showing the beauty of the college we have had people reaching out to give to the college because they fell in love with the campus and community, so share the beauty of our campus.

- i) COVID numbers- We've had five direct cases in the last month, and there have been 5 in direct cases reported. No students in quarantine in CPA as of October 13th. Remember to wear your mask, social distance, and sanitize.
- j) Commencement- Fall will be a face-to-face commencement. We want to have students and guests sign up for a time to get their diploma and pictures. Everyone will be required to wear a mask, but we want to give students the ability to have commencement that's as normal as possible. May graduates will also be able to graduate in fall.
 - i) SGA's Ideas- Outdoor options or having Virtual Plus as a backup. Alphabetically or by major. We also need to make sure to celebrate our students on Campus. We could also have a drive by or parade. Another Idea could be having graduation by major at different times.. We could split up the bigger majors or combine smaller majors if needed.
- k) Spring Break- We are planning to move forward to have spring break as planned.
- l) We are having an accreditation review process coming up soon. This happens every ten years, and we will be looked at and monitored. Look out for more information about this.
